Mark 1: 9 At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 As Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. 11 And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."12 At once the Spirit sent him out into the desert,13 and he was in the desert forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals, and angels attended him.14 After John was put in prison, Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God.15 "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!"16 As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 17 "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." 18 At once they left their nets and followed him.19 When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets.20 Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him. 21 They went to Capernaum, and when the Sabbath came, Jesus went into the synagogue and began to teach. 22 The people were amazed at his teaching, because he taught them as one who had authority, not as the teachers of the law. 23 Just then a man in their synagogue who was possessed by an evil spirit cried out,24 "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are -- the Holy One of God!"

Meditate with me today on the word *and* and its place in the economy of God. Technically, in literary jargon, the word *and* is a conjunction: it conjoins things. It takes one part of a sentence by the hand and links it to another – and another and another. The writer of the 1^{st} edition of the Gospel of Mark is famous for his use of the word *and*. He doesn't organize Jesus' life and ministry in a chronological fashion: he begins with Jesus' baptism, not his birth, and he ends with Jesus' crucifixion and an empty tomb – no resurrection appearances. Everything in between is constructed as a person strings pearls, one after another, but not necessarily in any particular order. Mark moves his reader from one scene to the next, one story to the next, by his use of the word and. He uses this word 1,286 times in his account of Jesus' life. How many times will you use the word and today?

There is magic in this little word: hugs and kisses, wind and rain, fire and smoke, peace and justice, forgiveness and mercy, bees and honey, faith and hope and love...you get the idea. Add a few of your own. We use the word and hundreds of times a day, even thousands. It is one of the most serviceable words there is. Whenever we pronounce it, like God sending forth a gust of life-giving Spirit, we bring things together. Imagine it with me: Women and Men, Jews and Gentiles, Black and White, Old and Young, Saint and Sinner. It must be God's favorite word because God is always trying to reintroduce us to one another, to bring the creation back together after we've attempted to divide it. It is important to understand that in the Good Book, God is a God of unity and togetherness, and we should give thanks for that.
