I Corinthians 2: 6 Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. 7 But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glorification.8 None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.9 But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him,"10 God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.

John 4: 23 But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for such the Father seeks to worship him. 24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth."

CONTEMPLATION AS A WAY OF SEEING


The ability to step back and calmly observe our own inner dramas, without rushing to judgement, is the foundation for all spiritual insight. It is the primary way of dying to oneself, as Jesus put it. He lived it personally and even referred to it as the way to God. Buddha taught it. Whatever you call it, such calm, egoless seeing of the world is characteristic of persons at the highest levels of living, doing and loving in all cultures and religions. These persons are the ones we often call sages, wise or holy people. They see as all mystics see - with an insight that is beyond merely looking on with the eyes, only. Many call it the contemplative mind. Paul called it the mind of Christ. I must leave you with no doubt that what he was talking about is an alternative consciousness to our ordinary, calculating, judging and misjudging mind.

Don't let the word mystic scare you. It simply means one who has moved from all mere belief systems or belonging systems to a more universal, inner experience. All spiritual traditions agree that such a movement is possible, desirable, and available to everyone. If fact, Jesus seems to say that's the whole point: I am the Way, the Truth, the Light.

Ash Wednesday

We will mark the start of the Lenten season with Ash Wednesday observances on Wed., March 5. Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we encounter our own mortality and confess the things we would have done differently. The use of ashes as a sign of repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship traditions, and the *Imposition of Ashes* can be powerful nonverbal experiential way of participating in the call to forgiveness and reconciliation.

Blessing Box Reminders

When outside temperatures begin to freeze, please do not place items like glass bottled drinks, carbonated beverages, and any liquids in thin plastic containers

into the Blessing Box, as they can freeze and potentially burst or become unusable in cold weather.

Key points to remember:

Glass containers: These are prone to breaking when frozen.

Canned drinks with high carbonation: The pressure from freezing can cause the cans to explode.

Thin plastic containers: These can crack or break when exposed to extreme cold.

Instead, focus on donating items such as:

canned goods with pull tabs, individually packaged snacks, dry goods like pasta and rice, warm clothing items like hats and gloves, and hygiene products with sturdy packaging.
