Civility

Matthew 12: 34 You brood of vipers, how can you who are evil say anything good? For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks.

Matthew 15: 16 "Are you still so dull?" Jesus asked them. 17 "Don't you see that whatever enters the mouth goes into the stomach and then out of the body? 18 But the things that come out of the mouth come from the heart, and these make a man 'unclean.' 19 For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. 20 These are what make a man 'unclean'; Luke 19: 41 As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it 42 and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace. Revelation 20: 2 I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. 3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. 4 He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

Meditate with me today on the notion of civility and the place it has among the people of God. The word *civility* is derived from the Latin *civis*, or citizen. Its original use referred to how persons in the cities behaved toward each other — polite, urbane, and thoughtful. This, of course, was in comparison to the ruder and cruder crowd that lived in the countryside. There's been lots of talk about civility in recent years — especially regarding the apparent lack of it in

modern society. Few people defer to their elders anymore. Younger people don't get up to offer an older person a seat. Tact and finesse have been discarded for bluntness. Speech in public places is very often rude and offensive...every sentence contains an expletive. Our public officials running for office have devolved into name calling and blatantly making stuff up about their opponents. Simply put, it appears as if the barbarians have finally won. But you know what? I am not surrendering to the lack of civility that has become de rigueur.

In 410 Alaric and the Vandals sacked the city of Rome. In 413 CE, St. Augustine composed *The City of God (De Civitas Dei)*. Responding to the Vandals' destruction of Rome, Augustine wrote about the contrast between the ways of our earthly cities and the ways of the heavenly city. Perhaps if you and I could spend more time in the presence of the Holy our speech and manners would be greatly affected. In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus expressed his desire that citizens of earth behave in ways that modeled citizens of heaven. Our own manners and morals, refined by constant association with the deity, will be a joyous gift to an often difficult and unpleasant environment.
