FROM THE PASTOR

Ripeness

Ephesians 4:11-15 And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature adulthood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by cunning people, by their craftiness in deceitful wiles. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ.

Meditate with me this Easter week on what ripeness means, completeness, fullness, coming to spiritual maturity. The ancient Greeks had a word for coming to maturity: entelechy. It meant the quality living things possess in themselves that will come to full fruition when they reach their proper end. They had in mind the pumpkin seed becoming a pumpkin; and apple tree from an apple seed, and oak tree from tiny acorn. They even applied it to a child who will one day become an adult. They applied entelechy to a baby soul that will mature into a mature soul, a soul fully developed and blessed with wisdom, compassion and joy. It was Saint Augustine (354-430 CE) who said that our spirits, when they get to heaven, will exist at the perfect stage of development, neither too young nor too old. Think about this as you notice the plants, animals and people around you today: God has created a world that is always moving toward fullness and maturity. Most of what is ailing our world today is a result of spiritual and emotional immaturity – emphasizing self-centeredness, selfishness, and the inability to consider or sacrifice on behalf of the needs of others.

What will you and I be like when we become truly ripe; when we fully become Easter people? Are you and I living in a manner that facilitates spiritual maturity? Let us pray that God tends the soil where our spirits take root until we reach true fullness, completeness, maturity....and, hopefully for the sake of the world, in this earthly life.
