Prayers and Change

Luke 15: ³Then Jesus told them this parable:⁴ "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? 5 And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶ and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.'7 I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent. 8 "Or suppose a woman has ten silver coins and loses one. Does she not light a lamp, sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ And when she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost coin.' ¹⁰ In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

God doesn't love us *if* we change. God loves us so that we *may* change. Live by these words. For those who spend time in prayer you learn to prefer God's judgement over that of human beings. God always outdoes us in generosity, forgiveness and receptivity. God is more loving than even the person you believe loves you the most. All you need to do is bring today's version of yourself for God's new dose of love and mercy. In our faith we shall always be immature and inadequate. It is not how perfect our soul is as we offer it to God, but our willingness to offer ourselves to God to be useful in God's loving work.


God doesn't lead us beside the still waters to shame us. Even if we were raised in ways that could be punitive at times, God does not motivate us by shaming us or making us feel guilty. We've all been on the receiving end of that stick from time to time. It never works! We simply close down and stop trusting, or become defensive to avoid further vulnerability. Some lie. Some hide.

God always calls out to us...Adam, Eve, where are you? God always finds us. It is just a matter of time. God's way of searching for us works every time. God simply wants to love us deeper than we've ever loved ourselves. To be the object of God's affection is really quite wonderful. It makes me wonder why anyone would ever want to be left out of this. The search continues...see you Sunday.




Missions and Outreach Meeting
